Description As a culmination of the ministerial degree programs, this course provides an opportunity for the student to review, reflect on, synthesize and integrate the theological study and ministerial formation he or she has undertaken at Aquinas.

1 credit hour per term (meets approximately every other week)
The schedule will be negotiated at the first meeting

Enrollment is restricted to those completing MAPS or MDiv degrees.

Objectives

1. Personal appropriation of Catholic Christian theological tradition, and one's formation for/experience of ministry to yield a synthetic and integrated theology of and for ministry.
2. Assessment of one's learning in relation to program outcomes and mastery of each of the five habitus at the level expected by Aquinas Institute for graduation.

Readings Notes and papers from previous courses, and review of related texts as necessary.
Selected short texts that will be distributed in class.

Grades At the first meeting, the class will review a list of 10 course outcomes that students are expected to meet by the conclusion of the course. Grades are based as follows on those outcomes:

- A** Successful demonstration of 10 out of 10 outcomes, and distinction in at least three outcomes
 - B** Successful demonstration of 10 out of 10 outcomes
 - C** Successful demonstration of 5 out of 10 outcomes, at least one in each area.
- To get a passing grade in this class, one outcome must be demonstrated in each of the habitus areas
