



## Why Aquinas Institute?

Aquinas Institute of Theology is a Catholic, Dominican-sponsored graduate school of theology with an ecumenical outlook. The 800-year-old intellectual tradition of the Order of Preachers and the legacy of our patron, St. Thomas Aquinas, shapes our theological orientation.

It is not an accident that the only MAPS degree specializing in CGS in the world has its home at Aquinas Institute. There is a special connection between Dominican spirituality and the spirituality of CGS just as there is a special connection between the CGS movement and our institution. Sofia Cavalletti studied with Dominican theologian, Fr. Dalmazio Mongillo, OP for many years at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome. Like St. Thomas, Cavalletti came to understand that friendship with God is the goal of human life and that the pursuit of an ever-deepening friendship with God is best done in the context of friendship with others.

At Aquinas Institute, students are invited into the kind of study, dialogue, and—yes—friendship that Sofia and Fr. Dalmazio shared. Women and men, scholars and practitioners, young and old, all find a place at the table, learning from one another. Since 2005, Aquinas Institute has worked in collaboration with the U.S. national association of CGS to provide a rigorous intellectual and spiritual foundation to more fully support catechists in their ministries.

## How Do I Apply?

1. Complete and submit the online application for the MAPS-CGS Program and all required components:

- Official transcripts from all bachelors and graduate level studies
- Resume/CV
- Personal Assessment
- Reflection Paper
- Three letters of recommendation: Academic, Ministerial, and Personal
- Miller Analogies Test (MAT) or Graduate Record Exam (GRE)<sup>1</sup>
- Interview
- \$50 application fee<sup>2</sup>

When writing your personal assessment and reflection paper, we suggest that you specifically describe and offer examples that explain how your background and experience meets the criteria for the Sofia Cavalletti scholarship. We also strongly recommend that your ministerial recommendation comes from someone who can attest to your work as a CGS catechist.

2. Complete and submit the US Government Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and request the information be sent to Aquinas Institute of Theology. (Institutional Code – 01632)

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# Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies – Catechesis of the Good Shepherd





How Might the Shepherd be Calling You?

Through CGS formation, you have come to meet God through the eyes of a child and your own eyes have seen the gifts children bring our Church. You’ve already dedicated much time and energy making CGS available to children — building materials, seeking out space, writing album pages. But just as the children surface new questions the longer they are in the atrium, perhaps you find yourself asking some new questions as well:

- Where did this amazing work come from? Who were the theologians that most impacted Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi in their development of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd?
- How do we continue to make the spirituality of children discovered in CGS more accessible to the Church as a whole?
- Am I being called to explore this work more deeply and offer myself in greater service to the CGS movement? How?

The Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies with a specialization in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (MAPS-CGS) program at Aquinas Institute **is the only degree of its kind in the world.** Students in the program form a cohort learning community, walking together through ten academic courses interwoven with ongoing spiritual formation. They meet other catechists from around the country. They form deeper networks of friendship. They begin to answer the questions tugging at their hearts.

Just as Cavalletti’s background as a scholar made it possible for her to talk about God with children in a way that intrigued and enthused them, the scholarly formation provided through the MAPS-CGS program creates a foundation for present-day catechists inviting children into relationship with God. **Students who hold the MAPS-CGS degree possess greater theological,**

**scriptural, and liturgical expertise for their ministry as catechists.** Many graduates go on to assume leadership roles within the CGS community as association staff, board members, and formation leaders. Others pursue their vocations as directors of religious education, pastoral associates, full-time catechists, even chaplains.



Program Format

The Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies with a specialization in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a 48 credit-hour program offered in an online-hybrid model. The program can be completed in three-and-a-half years, during which students follow a set schedule of classes as a learning community, completing the coursework online and traveling to St. Louis seven times for on campus intensives.

Affording the Program

The following estimates for the MAPS-CGS cohort are based on a 48-credit hour degree program with four additional units of spiritual formation. **This estimated cost breakdown for the program is based on the 2021-22 tuition rate of \$800 per credit hour.** Students should note that tuition usually rises each academic year. Travel (includes transportation, food, and lodging) and textbook costs are listed as estimates. All figures included in this document are estimates and should be considered as such.

**On average, your cost each semester will be about \$3,900 including tuition, fees, travel, and books.**

Need-Based Financial Aid

All applicants must submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as part of the application for admission. Based on your demonstrated financial need, Aquinas will automatically make an offer of need-based financial aid up to 60% of the cost of tuition.

Sofia Cavalletti Scholarship

This merit-based scholarship is granted to newly admitted students who bring noteworthy service within the CGS community as catechists and/or leaders and who demonstrate a strong commitment to continued leadership in local, regional, or national CGS settings. The Sofia Cavalletti Scholarship provides up to 50% tuition for highly qualified candidates. There is no separate application for this award; eligible applications will automatically be reviewed by the scholarship committee.
